

## Message from the Parish Priest

Dear members of the St Anne's Family,

We would like to first and foremost thank you once again for your faith and great support to our Parish.

We appreciate the effort and contribution you have made and continue to make despite the difficult times we all face due the Covid-19 pandemic.

Brothers and sister in Christ, few years ago our parish contracted a loan to renovate the Rectory (**\$52,828.83**), to repair the Church Roof (**\$21,511.22**) and to renovate the Parish Hall (**\$256,326.23**).

St Anne's Parish is doing well so far, and we are moving in the right direction. As you have seen recently in our Q3 (January to September 2021) Financial Report, our Parish has met and continue to meet its financial obligation and we are up to date in all our payments with the exemption of **our church's loan of \$330,666.28** 

By the end of this year, we will need to pay **\$50,000.00** towards this loan. So far, we have a total of **\$22,137.30** in our Building Fund (\$12,137.30 raised + \$10,100.00 bequest received). We therefore need to contribute and raise another **\$30,000.00** (\$28,000.00 exactly) before December 31.

Times are hard, but we still need your help. We therefore appeal to you to donate and support our Parish in reducing the burden of this loan.

Please, donate to the Building Fund and help us raise this \$30,000.00

Thank you so much for your generosity and we wish you God's abundant blessings for you and your family.



**itwewin Corner** (*itwewin* is the Cree word which means 'the word' or 'as it is said...')

Did You Know.... Treaty 4 Land Acknowledgement.

"We (I) acknowledge that we are on Treaty 4 Territory, traditional lands of the Nêhiyawak (Cree), Nahkawé (Saulteaux) and Nakota and homeland of the Métis, Dakota and Lakota."

When Canada (British Crown) wanted to access the land in what is now western Canada, they negotiated the Numbered Treaties 1 – 11 with First Nations who held their traditional lands on the prairies. The Nêhiyawak, Nahkawê, and Nakota Nations had traditional lands in what is now Treaty 4 Territory. Therefore, when Canada (British Crown) wanted to access the lands in this area, they had to make treaty with Nêhiyawak, Nahkawe and Nakota Nations.

The Dakota, Lakota and Métis did not have traditional lands in this area when Treaty 4 was made, however, a number of Dakota, Lakota and Métis people were settled on these lands prior to and at the time Treaty 4 was made September 15, 1874, therefore, we acknowledge Treaty 4 as their homeland.

Prior to Treaty 4, anyone who wished to settle on a territory held by a First Nation, they were required to have the consent of that First Nation. This is the Natural Law of Respect given to First Nations by the Creator.
